All COVID-19 cases reported by MOH were confirmed by real-time reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (real-time RT-PCR) tests. A positive case was reported when the person in question was found to be positive for SARS-CoV-2 via a real-time RT-PCR test. Upon confirmation, the individual was isolated at COVID-19 designated hospitals and healthcare facilities. Active cases are defined as infected persons who were currently undergoing treatment, and hence, isolated and removed; the individual is assumed to be unable to infect other susceptible in the population, and hence “removed” from further modelling steps. This study did not consider transmission from positive isolated COVID-19 patients to health personnel as there was no evidence of this type of transmission occurring in the COVID-19 designated hospitals in Malaysia (Dass et al., 2021, p. 6)

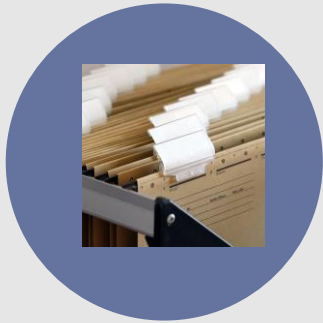

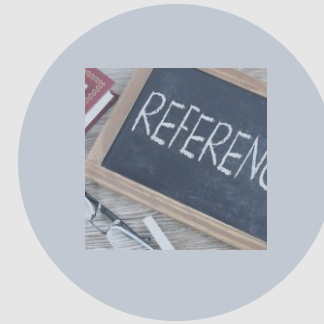
